### — HAMTRAMCK'S NEWSPAPER OF RECORD — It's official: St. Lads to hold its last Mass before closing for good

In a move that was expected, St. Ladislaus Church will close for good, with a final Mass to be held this Saturday, June 29, at 4 p.m.

The announcement came from St. Florian Parish, which has been overseeing the church for the last several years. It is the first Catholic Church to close in Hamtramck, leaving St. Florian and Our Lady Queen of Apostles as the two remaining ones.

Holy Cross Polish National Catholic Church, on Pulaski St., is not recognized as being officially aligned with the traditional Catholic Church.

News of the imminent closing of St. Lad's, as it is affectionately called, did not come as a shock to most.

Former City Councilmember Joe Karpinski, who was baptized at the church, graduated from the high school in 1980, and eventually married his wife, Cheryl, there said the city's changing demographics, with the city becoming home to a large Muslim community, led to the inevitable closing.

"It's very sad, but it's changing times," Karpinski said.

that position. Karpinski recalled the event.

"Another big (memory) was meeting Cardinal (Karol) Wojtylo; a nun told us that he was a very famous Polish cardinal who someday may be pope. I was in second grade. That's when we met him, and he did become the pope. A special day," Karpinski said.

This isn't the first time St. Lad's had been rumored to be closing. There were two previous attempts, in 2014 and 2016, but parishioners were able to persuade the Detroit Archdiocese that there was enough support and money coming in to keep its doors open - although the number of Masses held there were limited.

survive the pandemic, wherein the number of parishioners greatly declined, along with the church's finances.

The future of the building was not discussed. The Review reached out to St. Florian's Pastor, Rev. Tomasz Pietrzak, but he did not respond.

According to a source, the building's future use will be for "secular" purposes, but not for "unbecoming use." It was not immediately known what would be considered "unbecoming use."

The Parish celebrated its 100th anniversary four years ago.

migrant population grew to over 50,000 people.

But in the 1970s and 1980s, the city's population began steep decline to about 20,000. That loss of residents eventually forced the parish to close the high school in 1982.

Its elementary school closed 10 years later, as the Polish population in Hamtramck continued to decrease with more and more families moving to the northern suburbs of Warren and Sterling Heights.

The school has now morphed into a public charter school.

The church will be open this afternoon, Friday, June 28, for those interested in taking photos of the interior.

### The public responds to mayor

Social media has weighed in on the flap over Mayor Amer Ghalib not knowing about Gov. Gretchen Whitmer's surprise visit to the city last week.

And, as expected, the reaction from people is all over the place.

First a recap of what happened.

Last Wednesday a Juneteenth celebration was held at Keyworth Stadium honoring the Negro League baseball players who once played there. The mayor and city council were notified of this event prior to last Wednesday.

What wasn't known is that Gov. Whitmer decided just prior to the event - on the morning of - to stop by and sign into law a new state bill making May 2 "Negro Leagues Day."

Neither Ghalib nor any city councilmember attended the event.

Ghalib said he was at another Juneteenth event here in Hamtramck, although that one started at 10 a.m., and the Keyworth event started at noon.

Here's how Ghalib reacted on former Mayor Karen Majewski's Facebook page about not being notified of Whitmer's surprise visit.

"The mayor, city officials and administration didn't know about this surprise visit," Ghalib said, referring to himself in the third person.

"But if city staff or officials were responsible for this miscommunication and disrespectful behavior, then we know how to fix that kind of behavior."

Ghalib did not explain why he thinks Gov, Whitmer doesn't "like" him.

The alleged snub even got the attention of a Metro Times reporter who wrote about the flap - with a headline that said:

Special to The Review If you had told pretty much anyone attending high school at Hamtramck's St. Florian in the early 1970s that St. Ladislaus Church was closing, you would have been met with, at best, a smirk or a snide "too bad, so dad."

Why?

Since I was at that high school at St. Florian, we were fierce rivals of St. Ladislaus.

However, having been informed of that fact a few weeks ago, I met the news with a far-different response.

You see, the intensity of high school rivalries tend to wane as one moves

Furthermore, we were also married at St. Lad's Church, in 1986, where we had become parishioners a few years earlier.

- then, before you knew it, the 90th anniversary in 2010 – the latter of which featured a celebratory banquet at which I had the humbling honor of having been a guest speaker.

Then, in 2014, St. Lad's dodged the first of a couple bullets: while having ceased to exist as a parish on its own, in 2012, the new John Paul II Parish, consisting of St. Lad's, Transfiguration, Our Lady Help of Christians, and St.

Louis the King, made the decision to close St. Lad's, though an organized coalition of former Lad's parishioners would successfully lobby the Archdiocese not to go through with it, citing procedural irregularities.

Then came bullet number two: the parish, once again, decided to close St. Ladislaus Church, and this time it was then St. Florian pastor Fr. Miroslaw Frankowski who swooped in at

the 23rd hour, offering to take on St. Ladislaus as a Chapel of St. Florian.

And, so it was.

The third time however, was not the charm.

After significant dropoffs in church attendance and contributions in the post-COVID pandemic era, the decision was finally made, by the Archdiocese, that the beautiful, modern, Romanesque-style St. Ladislaus Chapel, the brainchild of architect Arthur DesRosiers, would be remanded to secular use as of July 1, 2024.

In other words, closed.

So, not only did you not get a smirk or snide comment from this former rival of St. Lad's on the church's closure, but, on June 22, 2024 - as the last Mass I lectured drew to a close, one week before the last Mass ever to be celebrated there - I found myself unsuccessfully fighting back tears at the impending closure of that beautiful House of God.


