Work is set to begin on park improvements

Final plans and funding are finally complete and it's a go for a major park renovation in the city.

Although groundbreakings for the ambitious projects were held a few weeks ago, it took additional time to get contractors, plans and funding all in the same place at the same time, said City Manager Katrina Powell in a

city-issued press release.

Work already began in Pope Park with the removal of pavers by volunteers and the removal of the iron gating by a contractor.

Some of the gating will be re-used in Veterans Memorial Park and any left over will be preserved since it has historical value. The gating came

Handling of AV ballots investigated

Hamtramck's Primary Election went off without a hitch earlier this month.

But something odd has popped up since then.

Three weeks ago two voters made a police report saying that someone they knew took their signed absentee ballot.

No other information is available, but City Clerk August Gitschlag said the matter has been assigned to a police detective.

It is illegal for anyone not related to a voter or a member of a voter's household to handle absentee ballots (postal and election officials are exempted).

This isn't the first time the handling of absentee ballots has been an issue.

Two years ago three Hamtramck men were convicted of a felony charge for illegally handling absentee ballots.

The use of absentee ballots here in Hamtramck has become more prevalent in the recent years as an increasing number of candidates running for office urge their supporters to vote using this method as a way to guarantee their votes.

In the most recent Primary Election, though, 166 absentee ballots that were issued were not returned. Did those voters forget to return their ballots or did something more nefarious happen to them?

In other election tidbits, Republican Presidential candidate Donald Trump has been getting a lot of attention for his plan to build a huge (or as The Donald would say, “Huuuge”) wall along the Mexican-American border to prevent illegal immigration.

Well, not so long ago in

from the former Dodge Main Plant, which at one time was the city's largest employer and taxpayer.

Renovations to the park include stamped concrete in the place of the pavers, enhanced lighting and landscaping and additional seating.

After Labor Day, work will begin in Zussman Park, located across from city hall. That park will receive the biggest makeover with an am-

phitheater, new walkways, seating, more parking and a pergola-like structure.

That project will take eight weeks to complete.

The third city-owned park to undergo improvements is Veterans Memorial Park. Powell said work there will begin late September or early October.

Improvements include the installation of a multi-age playground with exercise equipment, benches and bike racks, a sustain-

able wildflower garden and more.

In total the projects will cost over \$500,000. Funding came from a variety of sources, including the state, Wayne County's park fund and private do-

nations.

A fourth city park – Holbrook Garden Park on Alice St. – received a makeover by students in a GM summer intern program at no cost to the city.

on sale right next to the fowling site. Go ahead, drink up and play.

Monday, the last day of the festival, is packed with special events. The morning starts out with a Golab-k 5K run for those thinking ahead about getting in shape for a day of overindulgence in food and beer.

At noon, the Hamtramck Yacht Club Race holds court on Jos. Campau at Edwin. If you haven't seen this before it's worth getting here a little early before the Polish Day Parade starts.

Let's just say it's a lot of watery fun.

Just as Jos. Campau recovers from the race, the

annual Polish Day Parade takes over at 1:30 p.m.

The parade usually draws thousands of folks who find their own spot to watch on Jos. Campau from Holbrook up through the festival grounds. There will be plenty of marching bands, social and fraternal organizations, horse riders, elected officials, beauty queens and Polish dancers to be entertained by.

It's an old-fashioned small-town parade that is getting harder and harder to find these days.

After that, it's off to the festival.

How will the weather cooperate, you ask?

"The Hamtramck Labor Day Festival is finally upon us. Today (Friday, Sept. 4) crews will be feverishly setting up tents, tables, booths, stages and more. While they work out in the heat we'd like to take a peek into what it takes to get the word out about the festival.

"On Tuesday evening members of the planning committee made a rather raucous and 'Not Safe For Work' appearance on

Cave Radio's Mike's Unhappy Hour show. Perhaps this morning you saw Magdalena Srodek and Gitschlag on FOX 2 news for a cooking segment.

"Jon Mosier of 101.9 WDET and Willy Wilson from 99.1 CJAM both hosted shows featuring music from bands that will be appearing during the festival. Travis Wright, also of WDET fame, hosted Gitschlag on his Culture City program.

"Hats off to August and his efforts. Plus, many requests are coming in for onsite interviews by local news agencies during the festival, including one at 6:45 a.m. Gitschlag said he was going to '... pass on that one.' And of course, the Hamtramck Review has been supporting the festival every step of the way."

OK, Mike, you get one more comment:

"As you can see it takes just as much time and effort to promote the festival as it does to actually put it on — and you can help spread the word. Just pick up the phone, call an old Hamtramck friend or some family members, and invite them down for a fun filled weekend."

Limp Bizkit guitarist Wes Borland who announced that he and fiance and fellow rocker Carre Callaway would feature the restoration of their own recently-Detroit mansion in the Boston Edison neighborhood, also on the DIY Network's "American Rehab."

Speaking of renovating downtown Detroit's historic towers, the Downtown Development Authority approved the long-abandoned Metropolitan Building's redevelopment into an extended-stay hotel with ground floor retail. According to the plan, up to 130 more downtown hotel rooms could debut

after a \$32 million dollar redevelopment.

The Moroun family put on quite the show for local media as it touted the nearly 600 windows it has installed in the long-neglected Michigan Central Station, about 60 percent of the building's windows. John Gallagher of the Detroit Free Press wrote a series of articles examining the latest on the train station, including whether or not the windows are historically accurate and just what on Earth are the Mo-

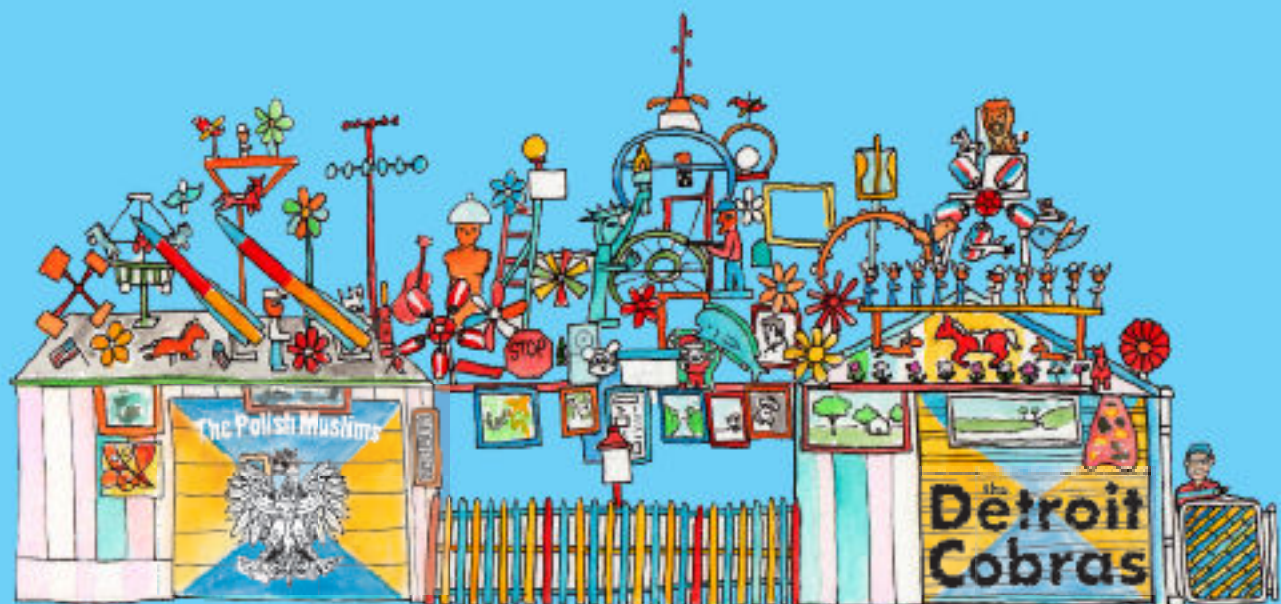
